This is the first of many periodic updates from World Rivers Day Chair and founder, Mark Angelo, in the lead-up to World Rivers Day 2025, set for Sunday, September 28 - our 20th anniversary

Greetings River Advocates,

We wanted to let you know that arrangements are already starting to develop for **World Rivers Day 2025**, set for **Sunday**, **September 28** (as always, falling on the fourth Sunday in September). This will be our **20th anniversary** - and as the world's largest celebration of rivers and the many communities and lifeforms they sustain, we wanted to reach out to you well in advance. <u>Please let us know of your plans!</u>

The celebrations and events taking place will be incredibly diverse and are limited only by our imagination. On one hand, we will see many of our **traditional physical events**, such as stream clean-ups, river-side planting and restoration efforts, biological inventories, educational tours, school projects, and community riverside celebrations. In addition, there will also be **many events of a digital nature** including online art festivals, the launching of new campaigns, the celebration of milestones, online essays and poems, digital photo galleries, new research projects, online river trivia events, river-related song posts, live-stream panels, and virtual film initiatives such as Global Environmental Justice documentary series, that includes many films about rivers.

We're hoping that river advocates from around the globe will be involved as part of this year's World Rivers Day Celebration, which commenced in 2005 and is now one of the planet's largest environmental events. Also, this year marks the **45th anniversary of BC Rivers Day**, which eventually evolved into World Rivers Day.

Many exciting events are already in the planning stages - From across Canada (ranging from the Pacific Salmon Foundation's Salmon Spotting campaign - to the BC Rivers Day efforts of the Outdoor Recreation Council - to the Guichon Creek Day at the BC Institute of Technology) - to efforts across Europe and Great Britain (from the major cleanup of the Tiber River in Rome by Più Blu - to the continent-wide celebrations organized by Uniworld river cruises - to the massive celebration of the Thames in London) - to Africa and the planned clean-up of the Lingadzi River in Lilongwe, Malawi by the Hope Givers Foundation among many other events across the continent - to the major festivities planned in Bangladesh and India - to the major efforts of river stewards and Riverkeepers from coast to coast across the United States - and from Taiwan, Japan, and China - to Central and South America - to the Caribbean including the great leadership efforts of Dominica, the nature island.

The list will go on and on in the months ahead.

<u>Themes</u> - World Rivers Day focuses on "the many natural, cultural, and recreational values of **rivers and streams** in our communities". In addition, many will be promoting several **sub-themes** including the incredibly important **link between rivers and oceans**, the need to **restore rivers** that have been damaged in the past, the importance of **engaging youth with local rivers**, the "**rights of rivers**", and issues around **river connectivity** to ensure adequate fish passage, which is in line with the good work of our friends at <u>World Fish Migration Day</u> which will next occur in 2026. All of these are important sub-themes to profile.

<u>So please, let us know of your plans!</u> The importance of clean fresh water has never been more important and World Rivers Day is a timely opportunity for literally millions of people around the world to come together to celebrate the importance of healthy vibrant waterways!

We are excited to again be working with the <u>Pacific Salmon Foundation</u> as a gold sponsor. They are a widely respected organization dedicated to the conservation and restoration of wild Pacific salmon and the organizer of global Wild Salmon Day set for June 1.
