

Greetings River Advocates,

On behalf of our World Rivers Day Chair, Mark Angelo, I wanted to let you know that we are now only a couple of weeks away from World Rivers Day 2025, set for Sunday, September 28, 2025 (as always, falling on the fourth Sunday in September). This will be our **20<sup>th</sup> anniversary** - and as the world's largest celebration of rivers and the many communities and lifeforms they sustain.

The celebrations and events taking place will be incredibly diverse, limited only by our imagination. On one hand, we will see many of our **traditional physical events**, such as stream clean-ups, river-side planting and restoration efforts, biological inventories, educational tours, school projects, and community riverside celebrations. In addition, there will also be **many events of a digital nature** including photo contests, online art festivals, the launching of new campaigns, the celebration of milestones, online essays and poems, new research projects, online river trivia events, river-related song posts, live-stream panels, and virtual film initiatives.

We're hoping that river advocates from around the globe will be involved as part of this year's World Rivers Day Celebration, which commenced in 2005 and is now one of the planet's largest environmental events. Also, this year marks the **45<sup>th</sup> anniversary of BC Rivers Day**, which eventually evolved into World Rivers Day.

### **Many exciting events are happening before, during and after World Rivers Day**

- In the run-up to World Rivers Day, New Taipei in Taiwan will spotlight Nanzai Creek as a symbol of urban river restoration and the city's commitment to sustainability with inspiring river stories and the premiere of the ecological film "Return to Nanzai Creek"
- In New Zealand the Nelson City Council is organizing a Paddle event on the lower Maitai River

### **Also in Europe**

- Leading up to World Rivers Day, The River Trust Society will be running The Big River Watch event, a citizen science app-based survey that helps build an important picture of river health across the UK and Ireland
- On the day of WRD 'The River' single by Ric Herrington's Audiatic Orchestra will be released as a free to download
- Also in Pershore, England the first formal Sister Rivers twinning agreement will be signed, creating an inaugural pair. The initiative has already gained national traction as civic authorities unite to amplify their influence over regulatory inaction.
- While Totally Thames Festival will be celebrating the River Thames with arts events, active adventures, environmental initiatives, heritage and education programmes
- The River Severn in the Arlingham Village Hall in England will be celebrating with speakers, arts, poetry, crafts, dancing while asking people to wear blue, green or white!
- Sixth annual riverside gathering at the OXO Tower Brasserie, London will offer a panel talk "From pollution to protection: harnessing nature to heal our rivers" and river clean-up
- International Atiyoga Foundation is planning a special edition of "Khaita Forever" meeting in Spain to discover the meaning of some songs, talking about preciousness of water and its deep symbolic meaning in Tibetan culture, while sing and dance along to them
- While in the Czech Republic, the organization Kreativní Praha in cooperation with the Prague City Hall and dozens of other partners are organizing a World Rivers Day Festival exploring the River Vltava with art, education, and community
- A major cleanup of the Tiber River will take place in Rome, Italy by Più Blu
- As well as Continent-wide celebrations organized by Uniworld river cruises

### **Meanwhile in Canada**

- The German Embassy in Ottawa invites professional and hobby photographers of all ages Canada-wide to submit photographs that express the vital role of rivers and the threats they are facing - [World Rivers Day Photography Contest – So German!](#)
- Annual activities planned by the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority in Ontario
- Ecologos/WaterDocs in collaboration with RegenTO are planning an event on Saturday, September 27 at the Evergreen Brick Works site by the Don River in Toronto. They will be leading a Water Cycle Walk as well as an information booth where they will be engaging visitors about clean freshwater ecosystems, rivers and wetlands through various activities
- While in Quebec, the Fondation Rivieres is planning a public gathering of 350 kayakers, canoeists and windsurfers celebrating Quebec's 4,000 rivers

- Margaree Salmon Association and Museum, in Inverness, Nova Scotia, will be running a special community celebration of their river heritage with live music, interactive youth science activities, river updates, special guests, community BBQ, and much more.

The Outdoor Recreational Council compiled a list of submitted events that will take place on World Rivers Day. As some sampling:

- Honoring World Rivers Day, BC Place in Vancouver will be lit up in blue
- Several River Cleanup events are planned across BC leading up to and on World Rivers Day such as:
  - The Seymour River Hatchery in North Vancouver is planning to host their annual estuary cleanup and planting event
  - A special Guichon Creek cleanup and planting will take place at the BC Institute of Technology
  - Annual Chilliwack Vedder River cleanup will be held once again
  - Tranquille Watershed Cleanup will take place in Kamloops
  - As well as Rivers Day Clean up on Serpentine in Surrey
  - Litter Cleanup at Cameron Elementary, in Burnaby is organized
  - In addition, river cleanups will be happening by the Kitimat River, Cowichan River, Squamish River as well as by the Elk River in Fernie, Elkford, Sparwood while cleanup events are planned at the Confluence in Grand Forks and by the Cottonwood Creek in Nelson

Other World Rivers Day Celebrations will take place in BC such as:

- In Maple Ridge the 32nd Annual Ridge Meadows Rivers Day event promises to be filled with lots of fun and interactive environmental displays, various exhibitor booths, live performances hatchery tours and forest/riverside walks
- Little Campbell Watershed Society in Langley, BC is planning a 'Creatures of the Night' community Lantern Walk in the riparian zone of the Little Campbell / Ta'talu River in addition to an information session talking about how a once-buried salmon spawning stream (in Vancouver BC) was revitalized
- The [Pacific Salmon Foundation](#) will be running a Salmon Spotting campaign
- While Hope Mountain Centre for Outdoor Learning will be running a Guided Paddle Event with kayaks and voyageur canoes once again on the Fraser River from Hope to Agassiz
- BLUE ECOLOGY will be holding a public talk as well as an art display at Berwick in Qualicum Beach
- Burnaby Village Museum is organizing a family-friendly event where visitors can learn about our local waterways and restoration efforts to help protect the environment. WRD Chair, Mark Angelo will attend part of the event and will be signing copies of his new book, "River Magic", written in concert with the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary
- As well as the great Riverfest celebration at the Fraser River Discovery Centre in New Westminster among many others
- Celebrations will be held all over BC to list a few, in Golden, Vanderhoof, Revelstoke, Pemberton, North Vancouver, Victoria, Port Hardy, Parksville, Logan Lake and Chase

Across the United States,

- Friends of the Chicago River is organizing a McCormick Bridgehouse & Chicago River Museum visit from June until October
- They also teamed up with the Chicago Ornithological Society to offer a unique way to experience the magic of migration through a guided paddle on the river
- Many activities are being organized by stream keeper groups and Water Keeper Alliance members
- The Great Works Regional Land Trust in Maine is holding a lobster fundraiser to help support their great conservation efforts across the region
- To the work of the California Institute of Environmental Design and Management in Arcadia, California where their event is going to take place as part of the ongoing Project EcoBlue at and around the Arcadia Ecohome, to reduce storm water pollution in waterways in the San Gabriel River watershed, and to showcase what local grassroots and average people can do for contributing to river health and restoration
- To Utah and the many Jordan River festivities, from walks to plantings
- While in California, the American Whitewater is preparing to hold its annual Feather River Fest, one of the country's premier paddling events
- Meanwhile the organization, SOLVE in Bonneville, Washington inviting people to join U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' park rangers in cleaning up trash from the Columbia River shoreline and help control invasive weeds from nearby areas followed by a tour of powerhouse and underwater fish viewing

In Australia,

- The World River Run Event by Thirst Foundation in Melbourne, Australia is inviting participants to run, walk or move for their local river, lake, or waterway by taking one small action to protect it, for example - pick up litter, share a photo, post a story, donate, or do something simple that reconnects them with their river
- The Australian River Restoration Centre is running a #ShoutOutOurRivers campaign asking people to share a picture or short video of their river or themselves by a river anywhere in the world
- Artists for the Anglesea River will be running an artists led gathering in acknowledgement of the UNSEEN in and around the river, with handmade lanterns inspired by creative imaginings of river movements
- While the International River Foundation's Symposium will be held in Brisbane, Australia

While in Africa,

- Events are being planned from South Africa to Egypt
- While river advocates, the Hope Givers Foundation is planning a major cleanup up of the Lingadzi River in Lilongwe, Malawi
- The African Rivers in Zambia is organizing a wide range of events such as exhibitions, environmental seminars, tree planting, water quality testing, marathon run and much more
- Meanwhile in Kisumu, Kenya, Happy Life 4 Development CBO is planning a river cleanup along the River Auji in Manyatta B
- As well as the tremendous annual events along the River Ethiopie in Nigeria

Among many other events across the continent

- In Portsmouth, Dominica, Pope Leo XIV has given a great injection to River Advocates and the Catholic Church with his institution of the New Care of Creation Mass in the liturgy of the Church which will take place on World Rivers Day
- Also in Dominica the National Swimming Association is planning a special event in line with our 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary
- Major festivities planned in Bangladesh by the Bangladesh River Foundation along the Buriganga River
- While the SAPNO organization is planning a march to raise awareness to protect the Bogura Karatoyya River also in Bangladesh  
Plans are set in Batu Gajah, Malaysia for a Riverbank Cleanup
- Meanwhile the Autonomous University of Nuevo León (UANL) and the Faculty of Civil Engineering (FIC) are planning a Metropolitan Rivers Forum in Monterrey, Mexico where aim is to share experiences with national and international experts in urban river restoration, as well as to discuss real solutions in the face of climate change
- To numerous activities set for dozens of locales along the Ganges River in India
- The Yamuna Drive by YSS Foundation is a flagship initiative under the campaign "Jal Hai To Kal Hai", dedicated to restoring the lifeline of North India – the River Yamuna
- Forum for a Better Hyderabad in association with Deccan Heritage Academy Trust are planning to also celebrate along the Manjeera River Bed, in Telangana, to highlight the importance and the many values of our rivers, increase public awareness, and improved stewardship of all rivers around the world

**Themes** - World Rivers Day focuses on "the many natural, cultural, and recreational values of **rivers and streams in our communities**". In addition, many will be promoting several **sub-themes** including the incredibly important **link between rivers and oceans**, the need to **restore rivers** that have been damaged in the past, the importance of **engaging youth with local rivers**, the "**rights of rivers**", and issues around **river connectivity** to ensure adequate fish passage, which is in line with the good work of our friends at [World Fish Migration Day](#) which will next occur in 2026. All of these are important sub-themes to profile.

**The importance of clean fresh water has never been more important** and World Rivers Day is a timely opportunity for literally millions of people around the world to come together to celebrate the importance of healthy vibrant waterways!

We are excited to again be working with the **Pacific Salmon Foundation** as a gold sponsor. They are a widely respected organization dedicated to the conservation and restoration of wild Pacific salmon and the organizer of global Wild Salmon Day.
